The Director will also be responsible for our ELD program. That person will provide planning, training, data tracking, testing coordination, and related tasks for all students. 1.2 Professional development will be provided for appropriate staff in high impact instructional practices and Common Core curriculum in ELA/ELD and math.

1.3 The charter will facilitate a single Curriculum Committee including upper and

lower grade teachers from each site.

1.4 The charter will continue to administer DIBELS and STAR 360 assessments (in both	
Reading and Math) 3 times per year to all students, as well as formative and interim curriculum-based assessments to monitor student achievement and academic progress in both ELA and Math.	
1.5 The charter curriculum committee will develop a common core report card.
